Arthur was born on the 22nd October 1946 in Llwynypia Hospital in the Rhondda Valley. The first school he attended was Blaenclydach Infants School. He then completed his state education at Blaenclydach Secondary Modern School. On leaving school he was first employed as an apprentice toolmaker.
